## **ABORTION RATES CONTINUE TO DECLINE IN ITALY**

Vast Majority of Italian Gynecologists Refuse to Abort Unborn Babies ROME, November 14, 2013 (Zenit.org) - Between 80-90% of gynecologists in Italy are refusing to abort babies, while abortion rates are steadily declining, according to a recent report from the Italian government. In a report by Italy's Ministry of Health, it was found that abortion rates in Italy had dropped from 106,000 abortions in 2012 to 111,000. This decline is in part attributed to a law which permits health care workers to refuse to perform abortions on the basis of conscience.

A 2010 resolution of the Parliamentary Assembly of the Council of Europe declared that "no person shall be compelled to practice the removal of a child or an embryo, and no one may be discriminated against in any way as a result of his refusal to carry out abortions."

The numbers of conscientious objectors in the health care field has increased, according to the report. Some 90% of gynecologists in Campania and 80% Southern Italy are refusing to perform abortions.
