FAITH ALONE vs. GOOD WORKS & GRAVEYARD SHIFT

Prior to retiring from the United States Air Force I was on graveyard shift at the 618th Tanker/Airlift Control Center located at Scott AFB, IL. Things were a bit slow and I was catching up on paperwork when one of my Evangelical co-workers asked me a question, "Does Faith alone make you a good Christian or do Good Works?" Well I knew where this was going. My co-worker knew I attended Divine Liturgy at St. Raymond's Maronite Catholic Cathedral in St. Louis, MO. I would to have to listen to him proselytize how the Catholic Church has it wrong about Good Works and how his church has it right. Well, after too many years of doing "mind-numbing" staff work I gave him his answer with four references, two Protestant and two Catholic:

- 1. King James Bible, The General Epistle of James, Chapter 2: 14 26 (Protestant)
- 2. Good News Bible, Book of James Chapter 2: 14 26 (Protestant)
- 3. The New American Bible St Joseph Edition, The Letter of James, Chapter 2: 14 26 (Catholic)
- 4. *The Holy Bible Douay Rheims Edition*, The Catholic Epistle of St James the Apostle, Chapter 2: 14 –26 (Catholic)

Here is the passage from The New American Bible St Joseph Edition:

14 What good is it, my brothers, if someone says he has faith but does not have works? Can that faith save him? 15 If a brother or sister has nothing to wear and has no food for the day, 16 and one of you says to them, "Go in peace, keep warm, and eat well," but you do not give them the necessities of the body, what good is it? 17 So also faith of itself, if it does not have works, is dead. 18 Indeed someone might say, "You have faith and I have works." Demonstrate your faith to me without works, and I will demonstrate my faith to you from my works. 19 You believe that God is one. You do well. Even the demons believe that and tremble. 20 Do you want proof, you ignoramus, that faith without works is useless? 21 Was not Abraham our father justified by works when he offered his son Isaac upon the altar? 22 You see that faith was active along with his works, and faith was completed by the works. 23 Thus the scripture was fulfilled that says, "Abraham believed God, and it was credited to him as righteousness," and he was called "the

friend of God." 24 See how a person is justified by works and not by faith alone. 25 And in the same way, was not Rahab the harlot also justified by works when she welcomed the messengers and sent them out by a different route? 26 For just as a body without a spirit is dead, so also faith without works is dead.

After reading my response he looked at me with a "shell – shocked" look and said, "Thank you for being so thorough. I guess it is a myth Catholics don't read their Bibles." I just smiled and turned back to my paperwork.

<u>PURGATORY</u> Sir Knight Christopher R. Cooper

Where does the term Purgatory come from? It is not mentioned by name in the Bible. The name, Purgatory, comes from Latin, "purgare", to make clean or to purify. Does the Bible support the concept of Purgatory? Yes, it does.

First, what is Purgatory? According to Pope John Paul II in his discussion, Heaven, Hell and Purgatory, "...the term purgatory does not indicate a place, but a condition of existence, where Christ removes ... the remnants of imperfection..." Purgatory is the condition Christ uses to cleanse us of venial sin so we can achieve a state of perfection.

Now for the question, "Does the Bible support the concept of Purgatory?"

The first passage to consider is 2 Machabees 12:46, "It is therefore a holy and wholesome thought to pray for the dead, that they may be loosed from sins." The Israeli commander, Judas, prays and makes atonement for his fallen troops. His hope is God will cleanse or purify them from sin.

The second passage for review is Matthew 12:32, "And whoever speaks a word against the Son of Man will be forgiven; but whoever speaks against the holy Spirit will not be forgiven, either in this age or in the age to come."3 Christ is speaking of this life and passage into the next life. He is pointing out some sin (venial) will be cleansed after passage into the next life.

The third passage for us to ponder is 1 Corinthians 3:15 "If any man's work burn, he shall suffer loss: but he himself shall be saved, yet so as by fire." St. Paul refers to venial sin as "man's work" and fire as the cleansing agent. Christ uses the condition of Purgatory to burn or purify sin from our souls.

In case you run into any of our diehard Evangelical brethren who still want to argue the point about Purgatory remind them the term "Rapture" never appears in the Bible either.
