WHY DO I HAVE TO GO TO CHURCH?

Why do I have to go to Church? It is a question most young people ask. The response of parents is, "Because I said so!" I remember this conversation from my youth. Fortunately I out grew this childhood irresponsibility about not wanting to attend Mass. The Holy Bible addresses this issue. There are numerous passages stating the necessity of keeping the Sabbath day holy and the need for Christian fellowship.

The Holy Bible first addresses the requirement of Church attendance in the Old Testament in the Book of Exodus chapter 20 verse 8, "Remember that thou keep holy the Sabbath day." (Loreto, 2005) The Word of God reminds the Faithful six days are for work and to tend to their worldly endeavors. The Sabbath day is for rest and to give thanks to God for all the blessings He bestows. In the Book of Deuteronomy chapter 5 verse 12 Moses reminds the Faithful to keep the Sabbath day holy with these words, "Take care to keep holy the Sabbath day as the Lord, your God, commanded you." (USCCB, 1986) Moses further explains the Faithful shall give thanks to God on the Sabbath for delivering them from their captivity in Egypt. Today the Faithful is encouraged to give thanks to God on the Sabbath for His Blessing; family, good health, steady employment, etc.

The Holy Bible encourages the Faithful to pray and keep the Sabbath holy not only as individuals, but also in groups of two or more. This concept is stated in the Gospel of St. Matthew chapter 8 verse 25, "For where two or three are gathered together in my name, there am I in the midst of them." (USCCB, 1986) Praying in groups lets individual members of the Faithful know they are not alone in their devotion to God. In his Epistle to the Hebrews St Paul states the need of group support for the Faithful in chapter 10 verses 24 and 25, "And let us consider one another to provoke unto love and to good works: Not forsaking the assembling of ourselves together, as the manner of some is; but exhorting one another: and so much the more, as ye see the day approaching." (Regency, 1976) St. Paul promotes gathering at meetings to pray in fellowship for the blessings from God. He explains that the meeting encourages the Faithful to perform good works as a physical sign of their Christianity to the world. St. Paul goes on to admonish those who miss the meetings. They are at great risk of succumbing to temptation and drifting away from God.

The Holy Catholic Church has names for the meetings of the Faithful and the day on which the meeting is held. In the Western Church the term Mass is used and Divine Liturgy for the Eastern Church. (Merriam-Webster, 1993) The meetings are to give thanks to God and celebrate the Holy Eucharist as commanded by Christ at the last supper. (USCCB, 1986) The early Church Fathers chose Sunday as the day for the Faithful to meet. (USCC, 1994) Sunday is the day of the Resurrection. Sunday reminds the Faithful of Christ' victory over death and his gift of eternal life to His followers.

The Word of God instructs the Faithful of why attending Church is necessity. The Faithful should take time to give thanks to God and take a day of rest from worldly concerns such as work. The Holy Bible explains the necessity of praying in groups and to avoid missing Church Services. Sunday it the day of Sabbath because it is the day of Christ' Resurrection and remind the Faithful of His gift of eternal life in heaven with the Blessed Trinity.

ST. MARIA GORETTI

The life of St. Maria Goretti is an example in the lesson of forgiveness. She was born October 16, 1890 A.D. in Corinaldo, Italy. (Martins, 2015) Her parents were poor tenant farmers. (Catholic Online, 2017) In search of work her father moved the family to Ferrier di Conca which is not far from the city of Anzio. Unfortunately, her father passed away. St. Maria's mother went to work in the fields to earn enough money to support her and her siblings. While her mother was away at work St. Maria stayed at home to take care of the domestic chores and look after her younger sister. In addition to these tasks St. Maria did domestic chores for a neighboring family.

One member of the neighboring family became lustful towards St. Maria. (Catholic Online, 2017) He made explicit remarks to her until one day he tried to force himself upon her. St. Maria Goretti resisted his attack. In a fit of rage he stabbed her numerous times. Her family took her to a hospital, but the surgeon was unable to help her due to the seriousness of the wounds. St. Maria Goretti was called from this world on July 6, 1902 A.D. (Martins, 2015) Before her death St. Maria Goretti forgave her attacker.

St. Maria Goretti was beatified April 27, 1947 A.D. and was canonized June 24, 1950 A.D. by Pope Pius XII. (Martins, 2015) She is the youngest canonized Saint. St. Maria Goretti's feast day is July 6. "She is the patron saint of chastity, rape victims, girls, youth, teenage girls, poverty, purity and forgiveness." (Catholic Online, 2017)
