SEVEN GIFTS OF THE HOLY SPIRIT

Faithful Navigator Christopher R. Cooper

In the Gospel of Saint John Christ promises an Advocate will be sent to help His followers spread the Word of God. (US Catholic Conference, 1986) This Advocate is called the Holy Spirit sometimes referred to as the Holy Ghost. The Holy Spirit is also mentioned in the Old Testament as a guiding force for the Faithful. One example is in the Book of Psalms chapter 143 verse 10:

“Teach me to do your will, for you are my God. May your kind spirit guide me on ground that is level.”

The Holy Spirit brings seven gifts to help the Faithful navigate the turbulent times of life. These gifts from the Holy Spirit are wisdom, understanding, counsel, fortitude, knowledge, piety, and fear of the Lord. (US Catholic Conference, 1994) Each of the gifts has its own unique attributes to guide the Faithful. The first gift of the Holy Spirit to examine is Wisdom.

Wisdom is a “wise attitude or course of action” or “good sense.” (Merriam-Webster, Inc., 1993) The Holy Bible is an excellent source of good sense. One example is the Book of Proverbs. “It [Book of Proverbs] is thus directed particularly to the young and inexperienced, but also to those who desire advanced training in wisdom.” (US Catholic Conference, 1986) The Holy Spirit brings wisdom not only to the Faithful who are just starting out in life, but also to those seeking more knowledge of God. In the Book of Proverbs the Holy Spirit takes on the role of a father instructing his children. An example is Proverbs chapter 3: verses 1 and 2:

“My son, forget not my teaching, keep in mind my commands: For many days, and years of life, and peace, will they bring you.”

The gift of wisdom will bring a long and happy life for the Faithful. From wisdom comes the next gift of the Holy Spirit understanding as stated in Proverbs chapter 2 verse 6:

“For the Lord gives wisdom, from his mouth come knowledge and understanding.”

Understanding is defined as a friendly or harmonious relationship. (Merriam-Webster, Inc., 1993) One example of maintaining a harmonious relationship is with our neighbor. Christ articulates this point in the Sermon on the Mount in the Gospel According to Matthew chapter 7 verse 12:

“Do to others whatever you would have them do to you. This is the law and the prophets.”

In the eighteenth century this passage was dubbed “The Golden Rule”. (US Catholic Conference, 1986) Always treat people as you would like to be treated. If you do not like people spreading rumors and gossip about you do not spread rumors and gossip about others. Christ also alludes to stop spreading rumors and gossip in chapter 7 verses 1 and 2:

“Stop judging, that you may not be judged. For as you judge, so will you be judged, and the measure with which you measure will be measured out to you.”

Christ gives out good advice which leads to the next gift of the Holy Spirit counsel.

Counsel is synonymous with advice. (Merriam-Webster, Inc., 1993) There are many sources of advice some good and some bad so always choose wisely. One source of sound advice the Holy Spirit provides the Faithful with is Christ. There many reasons why Christ is a good source of good advice. The Apostle, Saint Paul, summed it up best in his Letter to the Hebrews chapter 13 verse 8:

“Jesus Christ is the same yesterday, today, and forever.”

The Faithful can take comfort in knowing that Christ is a known constant of truth to rely on no matter how many corrupt ideas, weird notions, and bizarre morals society can and will come up with. The reliability of Christ gives the Faithful strength leading to the next gift of the Holy Spirit fortitude.

Fortitude is the strength of mind that enables a person to encounter danger or bear pain or adversity with courage. (Merriam-Webster, Inc., 1993) The Book of Psalms chapter 23 verse 1 sums it up best concerning fortitude:

“The Lord is my Shepard; I shall not want.”

Despite all adversity God is with us. He gives us the fortitude to overcome all trials and tribulations. It does not mean the Faithful will not stumble at times. Saint Peter is an example. He denied Christ three times, but in the end he found the fortitude to stay with Christ. Saint Peter went out to spread the Word of God and became the first Pontiff of Christ’s bride, the Church. The Word of God leads to the next gift of the Holy Spirit knowledge.

Knowledge is defined as the body of truth, information, and principles acquired by mankind. (Merriam-Webster, Inc., 1993) The Word or all knowledge comes from God. It is stated at the beginning of the Gospel According to Saint John:

“In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God.”

The gift of knowledge from the Holy Spirit teaches the Faithful that all we have comes from God. As the talk radio personality, Rush Limbaugh states, “Talent on loan from God”. (Limbaugh, 2005) Mr. Limbaugh is thanking God with this statement. Further Mr. Limbaugh goes on to state that he understands when God calls him from this life he will be held accountable of how well he used this gift. Understanding all knowledge comes from God leads to the next gift of the Holy Spirit, piety.

Piety is faithful and devotion to God. (US Catholic Conference, 1986) The Holy Spirit instructs the Faithful with the gift of piety only one master can be served. This concept is stated in the Gospel According to Matthey chapter 6 verse 24:

“*God and Money.* No one can serve two masters. He will either hate one and love the other, or be devoted to one and despise the other. You cannot serve God and mammon.”

The Faithful can only be devoted to God and no others. It does not mean making money is evil. Making money is evil when it becomes a god to those making it. Faithful devotion to God is the basis of the next gift of the Holy Spirit Fear of the Lord.

Fear of the Lord is not as ominous as it sounds. It is the “reverential fear and respect of God on account of his sovereignty, goodness and justice toward men. This is the foundation of religion.” (US Catholic Conference, 1986) The Holy Spirit teaches the Faithful to acknowledge God as the Supreme Being. He is good and just to all of His people. Fear of the Lord is the starting point for the Faithful as stated in the Book of Proverbs chapter 1 verse 7:

Fear of the LORD is the beginning of knowledge; fools despise wisdom and discipline.

Fear of the Lord only sounds ominous to those who cannot accept wisdom and discipline, but to the Faithful wisdom and discipline are pillars of strength.

The Holy Spirit brings seven gifts to help the Faithful maintain their path to God. Wisdom, understanding, counsel, fortitude, knowledge, piety, and fear of the Lord have attributes the Holy Spirit uses to teach and strengthen the Faithful. The one attribute all the gift of the Holy Spirit share is:

“For those who are led by the Spirit of God are children of God.”
The Letter to the Romans Chapter 8 Verse 14
